Attainment In 2014/2015, the Pupil Premium will be used to fund intervention work with targeted groups, Reading Recovery, writing tutorials, Saturday boosters, after school boosters, breakfast club and other additional clubs.			
Pupil Support In 2014/2015 the Pupil Premium will be used to fund additional support for PPG eligible children with play therapists, Educational Psychologist service and Speech and Language therapy as well as the purchase of new laptops and iPads for the EYFS provision.			
Attendance As attendance was also identified as an area for concern, additional support was also funded for an Educational Welfare Officer.
